OUR INVITATION

Your child is invited to participate in the *Roots of Engaged Citizenship* research project. The goal of this project is to study how young people become good community members. Your child may have participated in previous years. If so, *great!* We are following up with students who participated before to see how they have changed since the last survey and inviting new students to join.

YOUR CHILD'S PARTICIPATION

- Students will be surveyed in school about their ideas about being good community members.
- This survey is not a test and will not affect their school grades.
- Students who participate will receive a small prize (at least \$1.00) and be entered into a drawing at their school for a larger prize, such as an Apple® iPad mini.
- Participation is voluntary. Students must have a signed permission form to participate. You may remove your child from the study at any time.
- Students' responses will be kept completely confidential.
- We will return to survey your child annually pending available funding.

IMPORTANCE OF THE STUDY

- This study sheds light on young people's positive contributions to their families, school, and communities.
- Study findings will give schools, teachers, and parents real strategies for building community among young people.
- By surveying students across multiple years, we will collect vital information on changes that spark positive development.

Parent Permission for Child's Participation

We invite your child to participate in a multi-year research project about how young people become good citizens. This project is being conducted jointly by West Virginia University, the University of California, Los Angeles, and Search Institute.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS STUDY?

- The purpose of this study is to learn about youth behaviors and ideas related to good community membership. We plan to enroll approximately 4,000 students each year in the study.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO PARTICIPATE?

- This study is a multi-year study. This year, and in future years, students will complete a survey in their classroom at school. It will take about 45 minutes. Students will be asked questions about their activities and views of school, family, and community.
- Pending funding, your child will be invited to participate annually.
- We will ask students for their contact information to keep them informed about the study. We will only use their information for research and will always inform parents when we contact children under age 18.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND BENEFITS?

- The potential risk of this study is that your child may be mildly frustrated by the length of the survey. Your child can choose not to answer any questions and stop participating at any time without penalty.
- Your child may not benefit from being in this research study. There will be no cost to you/your child to participate in the study.

IS THERE AN INCENTIVE FOR PARTICIPATING?

- Yes! For doing the survey, your child will receive at least \$1.00 and a chance to win a drawing in their school for a large gift such as an Apple® iPad mini or something similar. One student from each school will win one of the large prizes.
- The large prize may vary in later years but will be something equivalent. Students who win the random drawing will need to provide their current mailing address to receive payment.

HOW WILL YOU PROTECT THE DATA?

- Only the researchers will have access to the information collected each year in your child's survey. Neither your name, nor your child's name, nor the name of your child's school will appear in any reports of this research.
- Each year, your child's identifying information (name and contact information) will be removed from his/her survey and will be stored in a locked cabinet, separate from his or her survey responses.
- Your child's name and contact information will only be kept so that we can link their answers across years so we can see how your child's responses have changed over time.
- We will be inviting your child to provide their contact information, including their phone number, e-mail address, and social media username (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, Instagram) so that we can contact them for research purposes. Like all items on the survey, these questions are not required.
- The data and contact information will be shared between West Virginia University, Search Institute, and the University of California, Los Angeles. We will alert all participating families at the completion of the study.

IS PARTICIPATION VOLUNTARY?

- Yes! You or your child may refuse to participate this year or in future years. You or your child may withdraw from this study at anytime.
- With your signature below, you are giving permission for your child to participate in this study both this year and once per year in subsequent years pending available funding. Each year, we will send a reminder to let you know when we will be administering the survey to your child.
- Refusal to participate or withdrawal will not affect your child or your child's class standing or grades and will involve no penalty to you or your child.

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FAMILY CONTACT INFORMATION
